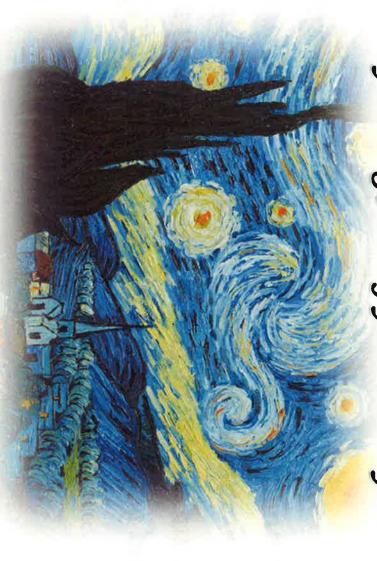

Definitions of Gifted

According to the Ohio Department of Education

levels of accomplishment when compared to others of their age, experience, or "Gifted" means students who perform or show potential for performing at remarkably high

fields. They require services or activities not ordinarily provided an unusual leadership capacity, or excel in specific academic capability in intellectual, creative, and/or artistic areas, possess by the schools." "Artistically gifted children and youth exhibit high performance Mary Codd

Gifted in the Visual and Performing Arts **Characteristics of Students Potentially**

- Outstanding sense of spatial relationships
- dance drama, music etc. Unusual ability for self expression through art,
- Good motor coordination
- Desire for producing an original product
- Practices regularly without being told
- Strives to improve artistic skills



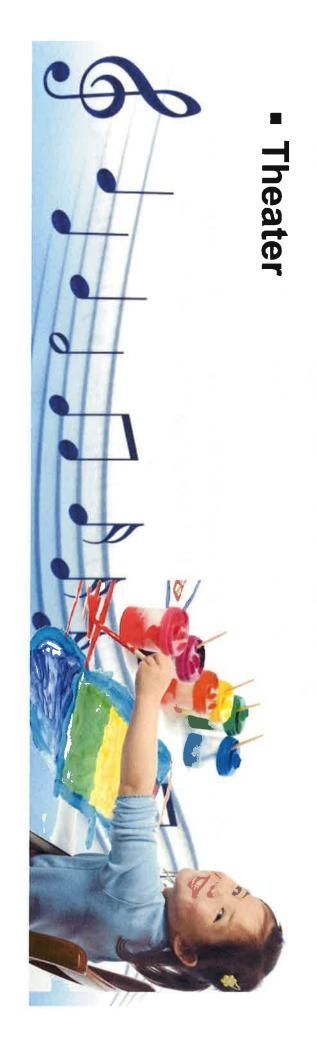
Gifted in the Visual and Performing Arts Characteristics of Students Potentially

- Good motor coordination
- Keenly observes others who have artistic skill
- Demonstrates talent for extended periods of
- Picks up skills in arts with little or no instruction
- High sensory sensitivity
- Sees minute details in art of performances



Visual and Performing Arts Identification Areas

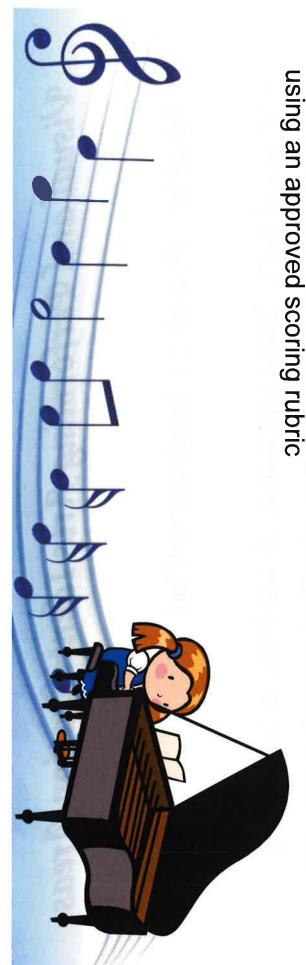
- Music: Vocal or Instrumental

Overview of Screening and Identification Process

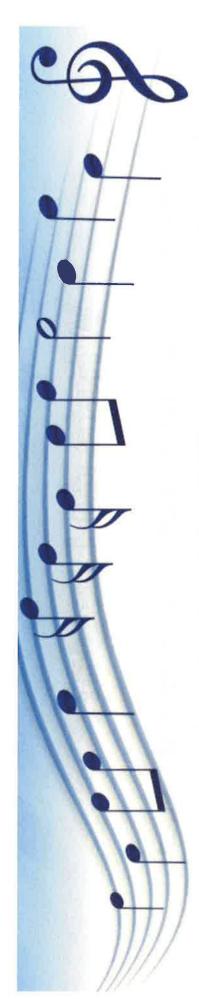
gifted in the visual arts includes the following three components: The screening and identification process for identifying students

- Nomination of the student for screening/assessment (except when every student in a given grade will be screened)
- 2. Screening process using an approved behavioral checklist
- 3. An evaluation of the student's visual art portfolio or performance



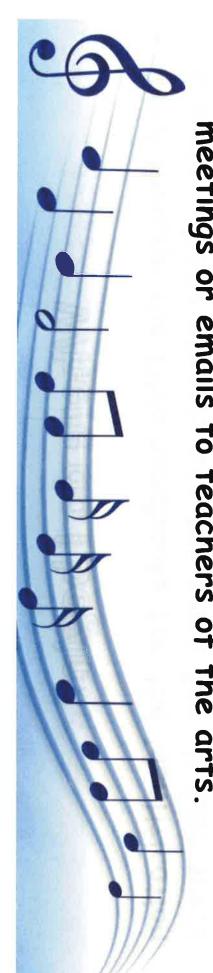
Where do I begin?

Portfolios/Auditions

Students will complete reflection forms related to art as well as put together their highest level of ability. Portfolios will be evaluated using a rubric. a portfolio for a minimum of 5 pieces of art work which they feel show shows the best of their abilities. Dance nominees are also asked to The pieces must have been completed in the last 24 months. Music, dance, and drama nominees must prepare an audition piece which complete a written reflection related to their audition piece.

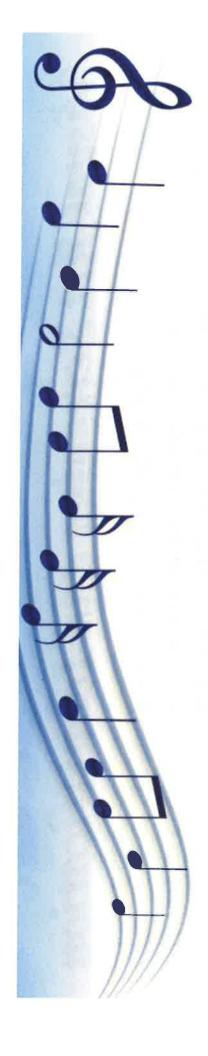

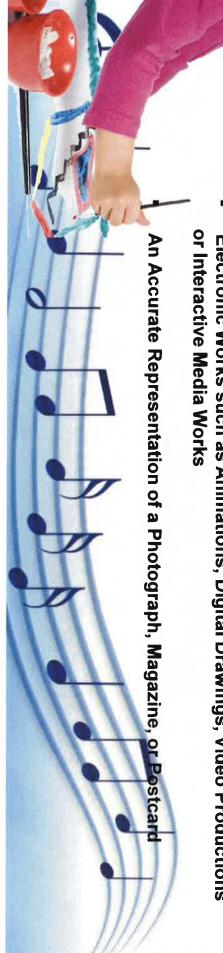
The Display of Work portfolio evaluation process involves the submission of at least five works of art by the student. The student must complete an "Artwork Written Response Sheet" for each work submitted

A Display of Work Portfolio May Include:

- Works of Art Created Inside or Outside Class

Photographs of 3-Dimensional Work such as Sculptures

- Artistic Photographs
- **Original Theatrical Scene Designs**
- Original Fashion or Costume Designs or Completed Pieces
- **Original Architectural Designs**
- or Interactive Media Works Electronic Works such as Animations, Digital Drawings, Video Productions

Music Screening and Identification

Screening/assessment activities may and typically do include :

- Solo or small group performances
- Free improvisation
- Structured audition activities (for example, asking a then replicate the rhythm or improvise a few student to listen to a few measures of music and measures)
- Workshop activities observed by the rater

These activities may also be used for the dance performance component.

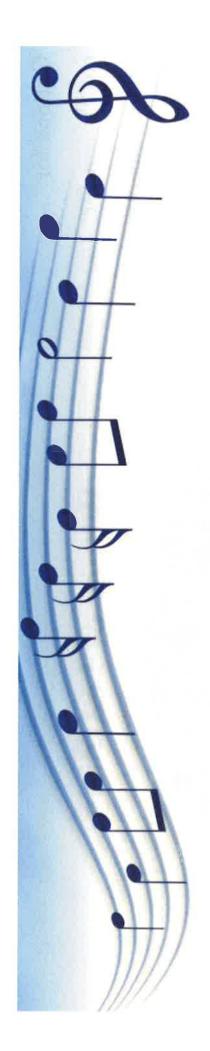
